SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES

NEW HEALTH CENTER IN AGUOTU, ISHIELU LOCAL GOVERNMENT AREA

In partnership with the government, community and the Rotary Club of Abakaliki, we opened another health center and project area. A Global Grant from the Rotary Foundation was approved last year, and the funds came through in May. The grant has paid for the equipment of the health center, a new borehole and training of health workers, maternal health promoters and clinic management committee. The grand opening took place on 5th July and the patronage has been very good.

RENOVATION and EXPANSION OF EPHUENYIM HEALTH CENTER

Ephuenyim Health Center opened in 2010. This year, the community was able to carry through a major renovation of the original health center building. The roof was raised and laboratory, pharmacy, labor ward and general ward were enlarged to meet the demands. The inauguration of the new building took place on 28th June.

AMURT PASSES NEW MILESTONES

AMURT passed a total of 24,000 births in the health centers since we started in 2010. We also crossed 1,100 cesarean sections since the first in 2017. In May AMURT managed a record for one month, 56 obstetric emergencies, in the health center and through referrals to AEFUTHA.

STRENGTHENING HEALTH CENTERS SELF-RELIANCE

This year, AMURT has made strengthening the self-reliance of the health centers the top priority. We have increased revenue and tightened the financial management. All the health centers now maintain computerized accounts. In addition to paying all support staff, the health centers now also pay a number of health workers. Our development goals is to ensure the long-term sustainability of the health centers.

ADOLESCENT SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

We welcome new staff Odinachi, as we added Uloanwu and Ohagelode project areas to the ASRH program. A pamphlet was produced to spread awareness of the dangers of substance abuse. Thirty teenage mothers have supported to learn skills to support themselves and their baby, ten teenage mothers supported by AMURT graduated from secondary school. The unit was active during Menstrual Hygiene week with programs in many schools. In each of the schools AMURT work, a competition was held with prizes for those who could demonstrate what they had learnt on reproductive health.

A NEW BATCH OF SCHOLARSHIP STUDENTS

Nine trainees from the health center have been sent to School of Health as part of AMURT's capacity building program for the communities. Five graduated after three years in school AMURT has hosted over 200 IT students from four schools that educate health workers.

NINE NEW BOREHOLES

The AMURT WASH team completed the drilling, installation and training for twenty boreholes, providing safe water in five different local government areas.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Our annual "Every Life Counts" fund raising drive was successfully concluded in January. This has enabled us to provide more life saving emergency medical services for mothers, babies and children. We paid for over 150 pediatric surgeries, and 120 obstetric emergency surgeries and 55 newborn complications.

HEALTH EDUCATION

The team of community health education workers conducted 78 meetings reaching a total of over 3000 people in villages throughout the project area with key messages: dangers of herbal concoctions, low birth weight, importance of hospital delivery, danger signs in pregnancy, the advantage of early presentation, and importance of ante-natal check ups.

ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

Through a Cooperatively Managed Revolving Credit Scheme, AMURT has empowered 112 more widows to start their own businesses to support their children. The program has extended to 9 cooperatives with a total membership of over 600 women.
